These identification cards are produced by the Pacific Community (SPC) to help with the identification of species of special interest (protected species) encountered by Fisheries Observers while on board commercial tuna boats that fish in the western and central Pacific Ocean (WCPO). The species included in these cards are the ones commonly recorded by observers on tuna vessels operating in the WCPO. The cards can be easily accessed by observers while working on deck during fishing operations to verify and correctly identify species. The cards also assist in training observers operating within the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission Convention Area.

Funding for the printing of these cards was provided by the Pacific Islands Forum Fisheries Agency (FFA).









Procellariidae








Species in this family have:

Species in this family have:

- · a wing length of \approx 26–42 cm (gulls) or 24-29 cm (terns)
- · nostrils as plain openings on either side of the bill
