CENTRALISED INFORMATION AND DATA MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

Purpose and Recommendations

Purpose

This session provides an opportunity for countries to share their experiences, issues and challenges regarding the establishment of centralised information and data management systems for improved DRM and CC decision making.

Summary

- Six countries have identified the establishment of centralised information and data systems as priority activities for support under BSRP II.
- NDMOs face several challenges in accessing reliable information and data and in sustaining server-based systems.
- This session will unpack some of these challenges and explore strategies for overcoming them.
- The session will feature presentations from a country with an established geo-based system (Cook Islands) as well as presentations from countries that aspire to establish similar systems.
