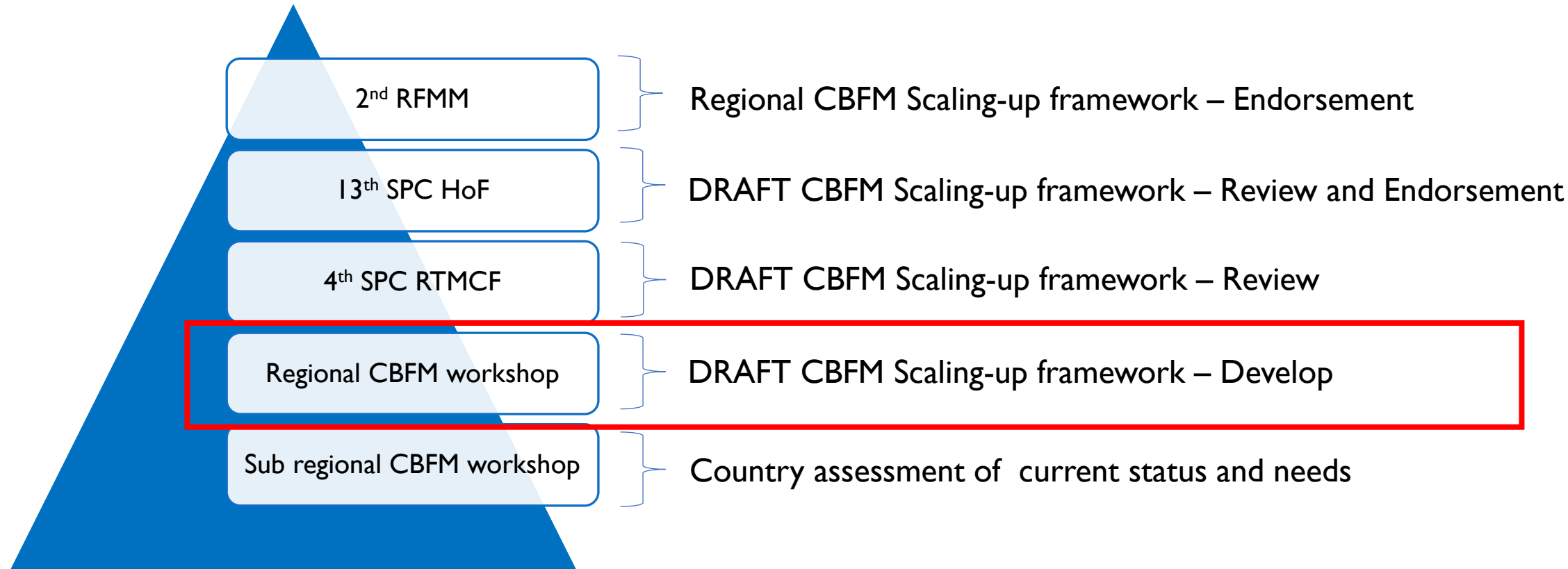

Direct Community-based Fisheries Management Actions

STRATEGIC DIRECT ACTIONS

A. Informing and awareness (1-way broadcasting):

B. Interactive consultation (2-way communication):
Community leaders, fishers and others have appropriate feedback mechanisms with government and each other

C. Joint action in communities and with stakeholders:
Communities with most need are directly supported to sustainably manage and develop marine resources

Develop and implement strategic plans for messaging, coverage and information strategy

Use radio, social media and video

Formalize feedback and communication mechanisms where needed - communities, between communities and fisheries agencies

Engagement with sub-national levels of government, strategically use available and develop novel processes
