Results by change type



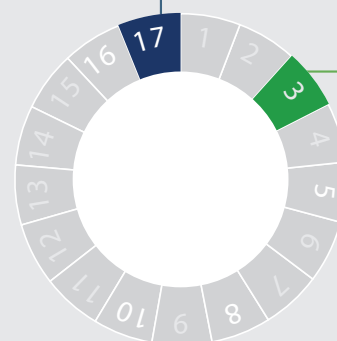
SPC's contribution to the Sustainable Development Goals
